

# Local priorities for Corby – You Said, We Did

In February, we set three local priorities – Road Safety, ASB Motor Cycle Nuisance and Drug Dealing/Misuse. These were based on what local people told us concerned them most in their neighbourhood, as well as local crime statistics and information from our partners (such as the local council).

These priorities have been the focus of much of our work over the last three months and below is an update about some of the work we've been doing to tackle them.

## ASB Motor Cycle Nuisance/Road Safety

Operation Pacify was created to tackle motor cycle nuisance in Corby. Since its launch in March, the team have:

- Seized 13 motor cycles.
- Reported 9 persons for driving offences.
- Charged 3 people for driving whilst disqualified.
- Issued 3 Section 59 warnings.
- We have received over 100 e-mails from the community giving information around motor cycle nuisance which have been acted upon.
- Seized 8 cars for having no insurance.
- We have completed speed enforcement patrols in locations highlighted by the community as being areas of concern and these will continue.
- We've carried out several parking patrols outside local schools.

## Drugs

- Following information received from the community, we've conducted a number of drug warrants, with positive outcomes. These are still under investigation and further updates will follow when investigations are completed.
- We've issued 17 warnings for possession of cannabis.
