

Local priorities for Corby Town & Rural – You Said, We Did

In October, we set three local priorities – road safety, motorcycle nuisance and drugs.

These were based on what local people told us concerned them most in their neighbourhood, as well as local crime statistics and information from our partners (such as the local council).

These priorities have been the focus of much of our work over the last three months and below is an update about some of the work we have been doing to tackle them:

- *We've issued 8 fixed penalty notices for speeding, with 8 drivers being given words of advice, and warning letters to those driving just over the speed limit.*
- *We've issued 4 Section 59 warnings and seized 8 vehicles for having no insurance.*
- *5 tickets were issued for obstruction in the vicinity of a school.*
- *We also carried out an educational day for children at West Glebe Park around road safety.*
- *We've commenced Op Pacify from 1 February, to tackle the increasing demand of motorcycle ASB and associated crime. A team of police trained off-road motorcyclists will be operating in and around Corby to catch offenders.*
- *Since October we've seized 7 motorcycles that were not road legal and 3 E Scooters as well as issuing 5 Section 59 warnings. 2 mopeds were seized and the riders arrested for Disqualified Driving, with one remanded to court.*
- *Since November, we've executed 9 warrants – 5 for the misuse of drugs and 4 cannabis factories, resulting in the seizure of drugs and money.*
- *We continue to work with the community to gather intelligence and seek further warrants for enforcement action*
- *We've carried out Stop/Search and issued 9 cannabis warnings for possession of class B drugs*
