

# Local priorities for Corby Neighbourhood Team – You Said, We Did.

In April, we set three local priorities – Road Safety, Drug Harm and ASB motorcycle nuisance. These were based on what local people told us concerned them most in their neighbourhood, as well as local crime statistics and information from our partners (such as the local council).

These priorities have been the focus of much of our work over the last four months and below is an update about some of the work we have been doing to tackle them.

- We issued warning notices to 40 vehicle users who were using them in an anti-social manner. This means if they are found to be doing so again, the vehicle or motorbike can be seized. We've also seized 6 motorcycles.
- We completed 23 speed enforcement patrols in locations highlighted by the community as being areas of concerns. As a result, we issued 22 fixed penalty notices for speeding offences and also sent a significant number of warning letters to drivers, to educate rather than prosecute.
- Working with council colleagues, we've carried out several parking patrols outside local schools and these will continue, the main aim here is to educate the risks and dangers of inappropriate parking outside of education premises. We also worked with partner agencies on Project Edward, a national campaign to reduce road fatalities.
- A number of weight limit breaches are currently being investigated by the Rural team.
- Following information received from the community, we've conducted a number of drug warrants. These are still under investigation and further updates will follow when investigations are completed.
- We've worked with partner agencies to identify and safeguard those at risk of being exploited by criminal gangs who then use their addresses to deal drugs from. Reviews of this activity are assessed and risk rated every month resulting in robust intervention.
- We've been highlighting the risk of leaving doors and windows unlocked during the warm summer nights and worked with residents to put prevention measures in place.
- We have also supported vulnerable victims and worked with other agencies to give security advice and prevent further offences.
- We have adopted the Kingswood estate as a priority area with additional patrols and days of action, supported by the Special Constabulary. The result of this focus has been a reduction of crime and ASB incidents.
